Letter From the CEO

Dear Kenosha County community members,

For 100 years, United Way of Kenosha County, along with our donors and volunteers, has improved lives and made Kenosha a better place for everyone. Although much has changed throughout Kenosha County and the world over the past 100 years, one thing remains clear: Kenosha is a caring community.

Our organization was founded on March 29, 1923 by fifteen concerned citizens with the goal of enlisting community support to meet local needs — The Community Chest. The following day, Kenosha News reported their meeting as "one of the most enthusiastic meetings of public nature ever held in Kenosha." Their first campaign, which used the slogan, "Suppose Nobody Cared," raised more than 1.5 million dollars in today's amount.

From there, the organization continued to keep up with current needs, serving the community through World War II and other historic events. In 1973, the organization's mission and brand was made to align with the national United Way movement, officially becoming United Way of Kenosha County.

Amidst the celebratory milestone of United Way of Kenosha County's 100th Anniversary, we reinvisioned our mission, vision, and brand statements to better align with serving our community now and in the future while remaining true to our founding principles.









